# REGULAR CITY COMMISSION MEETING TUESDAY, December 11, 2012 COMMISSION CHAMBERS

### CALL TO ORDER

The invocation was given by Father Bob Caudill, All Saint Catholic Mission.

Mayor Resnick led the Pledge of Allegiance.

# Resolution No. 3873: (Finance)

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF WILTON MANORS, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING THE POLICY ON RESTRICTED PARKING FUNDS FOR THE CITY OF WILTON MANORS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Commissioner Newton moved to approve Resolution No. 3873. Vice Mayor Carson seconded the motion.

Vice Mayor Carson stated that several months ago it was agreed that the overage of the parking budget be placed into the parking trust fund. She asked how staff intends to accumulate funds in other ways to increase the balance of the parking fund.

City Manager Gallegos stated that Finance Director Mays has created an enterprise fund. Director Mays explained at all expenditures and revenues will be accounted for through the new enterprise fund, allowing for 100% of the net revenues to be directly deposited into the parking fund. He also stated that in the FY 2012-13 budget about \$116,000 was used to support the General Fund and that it will continue to be reduced.

Commissioner Newton stated he wanted to see the support reduced by 30% or more. He stated that he did not see a stated percentage in the backup, to which Director Mays stated that he followed the Commission's directions as stated in a previous meeting.

City Manager Gallegos stated that a mathematical equation could be written into the policy but that the volatile state of the economy may not allow for that.

Commissioner Green suggested that the issue of reducing support for the General Fund be brought up during the budget season.

The motion prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote.

### **PUBLIC HEARING**

### Ordinance No. 1014: (Community Development Services)(First Reading)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF WILTON MANORS, FLORIDA AMENDING SECTION 030-030 OF THE UNIFIED LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS (ULDR) "DEFINITIONS" TO ADD A DEFINITION FOR FOOD AND/OR BEVERAGE CARTS; AMENDING SECTION 030-060 OF THE ULDR "DETAILED TABLE OF PERMITTED AND PROHIBITED USES" TO INCLUDE FOOD AND/OR BEVERAGE CARTS; AMENDING SECTION 030-110 OF THE ULDR "OFF STREET PARKING REQUIREMENTS"; AND AMENDING SECTION 030-111 ULDR "PAYMENT IN LIEU OF PARKING"; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Commissioner Newton moved to approve Ordinance No. 1014 on first reading. Vice Mayor Carson seconded the motion.

City Manager Gallegos explained Ordinance No. 1014 and the chart of the permitted uses.

Community Development Services Director Shafran stated that on the online agenda there were a few unsubstantive issues with the editing of the ordinance. Assistant City Attorney Horowitz reviewed the discrepancies with the Commission.

Director Shafran made a presentation to the Commission in regards to food, vendor and parking requirements.

Commissioner Green stated the Commission first began discussions regarding food carts and that they would be limited to existing businesses. Ordinance No. 1014 seems to be preventing any other carts from appearing. Director Shafran answered Commissioner Green's question as to how many carts are in the city to date, by saying that only one cart is in the city, located at an auto care business.

Mayor Resnick asked if a portable vending devise included vending machines, to which Director Shafran stated that they required a separate business tax license.

Vice Mayor Carson asked how no vendors would impact a train station, to which Director Shafran stated that vendor carts would be an enhancement, as the Planning and Zoning Board has discussed as a positive pedestrian element. This was staff's recommendation, and not voted on by the Commission at a previous meeting.

Commissioner Green stated that he agrees with not requiring retail spaces to have parking, citing Delray Beach's concern of having only restaurants in their downtown area.

Mayor Resnick asked if there is a provision in the current code that distinguishes between restaurant and retail.

Mayor Resnick opened the public hearing.

Nick Berry, 1901 Coral Gardens Drive – spoke on three issues with the ordinance, his objection to food vendors near the conceptual train station and in the Arts and Entertainment District; removing retail parking requirements; and payment in lieu of up to only 40%.

Robert Cassidy, 2625 NE 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue – supported Nick Berry's statement and added parking for retail establishments and his desire to have more diverse establishments. This ordinance will help retail work in Wilton Manors instead of the businesses using malls.

Mayor Resnick closed the public hearing.

Commission discussion ensued.

Vice Mayor Carson stated that she feels parking requirements shouldn't keep being reduced when parking is a serious problem within the city. She stated her hesitation on the elimination of retail parking requirements.

Commissioner Green supports the elimination of retail parking requirements but does not agree with the prohibition of food vendor carts. He also stated he was not in favor of restricting the payment in lieu to 40% but would rather allow up to 75% payment in lieu of parking.

Commissioner Newton also agreed with allowing up to 75% for payment in lieu of parking.

Discussion ensued.

Commissioner Newton amended the motion to allow up to 75% payment in lieu of parking, up to 20 spaces in all mixed use districts.

The motion prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote.

# Commissioner Newton moved to approve Ordinance No. 1013. Vice Mayor Carson seconded the motion.

City Manager Gallegos explained Ordinance No. 1013, stating that the ordinance was tabled from the previous meeting in order to allow for Community Development Services Manager Shafran to give a presentation.

Director Shafran gave a presentation, showing a map of the affected areas.

After Commission discussion with staff, Commissioner Newton withdrew his motion.

### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

Commissioner Carson asked the City Attorney's office to update the city's pending litigation list.

Commissioner Newton asked for an update on the old Wings 'n Things property to which Director Shafran stated the finishing touches were being completed and that everything is in order.

Director Shafran also stated that the Rooftop Café is coming in to finish building permits.

City Manager Gallegos announced the upcoming Evening in Paradise, Saturday January 19<sup>th</sup>, which is a joint fundraiser with Pride Center.

Mayor Resnick asked staff to advertise the city's holiday hours.

# City Attorney's Report

Nothing additional to written report was given.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

# Request for Extension of Hours to Serve / Sell Alcohol – The Manor Complex (Community Development Services)

City Manager Gallegos explained the request to the Commission, reminding them that it has also been requested for Friday night, December 28<sup>th</sup> to also be included.

Commissioner Green wondered why they needed an extension on New Year's Day night.

Vice Mayor Carson moved to approve Friday night, Saturday night and Monday night. Commissioner Newton seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote.

# Discussion on Children's Art Project (City Manager)

City Manager gave an overview of the Children's Art Project.

Commissioner Green moved to approve the Children's Art Project. Commissioner Newton seconded the motion.

Mayor Resnick expressed he was disturbed that this project was advertised before obtaining the Commission's consent.

Commissioner Green asked if there was a maximum size for the bricks, or a maximum number of bricks that could be sold.

Krishan Manners, Director of the Wilton Manors Development Alliance, stated that no limit has yet been set, but that 4x8 and 8x8 pavers will be available.

Commissioner Newton stated he would not like for businesses or individuals to be able to buy 10 bricks to use for one large logo, but that they can buy 10 individually logoed bricks.

Mr. Manners stated that the location will be a limited area in the park.

An amendment to the motion was made to allow 4x8 bricks and 8x8 pavers to be used individually. The motion prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote.

# Request for Road Closure - HeARTs on the Drive Event (Community Development Services/Leisure Services)

Community Services Director Shafran gave an overview on the event which would require a road closure. The road closure approval is necessary to move forward with FDOT.

Commissioner Green moved to approve the motion. Commissioner Newton seconded the motion which prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote.

Commissioner Newton moved to approve the waiver of fees for Hagen Park on Saturday, January 5<sup>th</sup> Kickoff event from 8 a.m.to 12 p.m. Commissioner Green seconded the motion.

Discussion ensued.

David Ellich, representing the ATC Technical group, clarified for Mayor Resnick that although the group is sanctioned by the School Board, it is not financially supported by it. It is strictly fundraised by students, parents of the students and Mr. Ellich.

### St. Clements Church Annual Festival

Commissioner Green moved to approve the festival at St. Clements Church. Vice Mayor Carson seconded the motion.

Mayor Resnick expressed his concern on the number of resident complaints during the festival and stated that it needs to be a conveyed to the church to respect their neighbors. Commander Costello stated that they would be meeting with the church.

After discussion the motion prevailed by a unanimous roll call vote.

Vice Mayor Carson asked for information on workforce housing at a future meeting.

Vice Mayor Carson asked that Paul Kuta's comments on the city's pension be addressed.

Vice Mayor Carson asked staff to research amending Section 1085 of the City Code to provide for four annual yard sales instead of two.

Vice Mayor Carson expressed her desire to serve as the liaison to Wilton Manors Elementary School.
