

Tom Green was elected to the Wilton Manors City Commission in 2008 and was selected by his fellow commissioners as Vice-Mayor in November of 2010. Previously he served as a commissioner of the Central Broward Water Control District for 12 years.

Tom is a professor-emeritus of Broward College. He also served as a visiting professor at the Kolej Damansara Utama in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia and the Pan American Center for Education in Cuenca, Ecuador. He has served as president of the Faculty Senate and of the Faculty Union at Broward College. As a member of the Faculty he was selected as "Professor of the Year" and was awarded an endowed teaching chair by the college. Tom also served as president of the Florida Association and as a member of the Board of Directors for National Education Association and the Florida Education Association. Tom is now an Adjunct Professor at Broward College. He teaches courses in Geography and Conservation of Natural Resources.

Vice-Mayor Green serves as the Wilton Manors representative to the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization. He also serves as a member of the Florida League of Cities' Legislative Policy Committee for Energy and Environmental Quality. Currently he serves as Vice President of the Island City Foundation. He served for two years as a member of the Broward Government Efficiency Study Committee.

In Wilton Manors Tom is a member of the Friends of the Library, Taste of the Island Committee, the Historical Society, Wilton Manors Mainstreet, the Dolphin Democrats, the Central Area Neighborhood Association, the Eastside Neighborhood Association, and the Wilton Manors Westside Homeowners Association. He is a strong supporter of the Wilton Manors Business Association.

Vice-Mayor Green has made the environment his highest priority as a city commissioner. He has worked to improve the quality of life for residents of Wilton Manors by urging improvements in the city's recycling program, mixed-use business codes, and pedestrian friendly streets. Tom was instrumental in getting bus shelters and reserved parking for electric and hybrid cars in Wilton Manors. He has worked to increase the city's "green" canopy and has urged the adoption of "green" building ordinances. He is a longstanding member of the Sierra Club and Greenpeace.
